



Alexis Stevens, tonight at the Bombay Bicycle Club!

Folk singer Alexis Stevens is kicking off her nationwide Backroad Gravel Tour in her home state of Iowa, with her second stop being at the Bombay Bicycle Club on Wednesday, August 29.

Alexis was raised in Marshalltown and has been playing music for the better part of 17 years. After living in Oregon and California for a decade or so, she returned to her Iowa roots in 2008. That year she released her debut album “Flood or Drought” and began writing songs for her second, self-titled album, which was released in June.

In her new album, Alexis creates a beautiful picture of human experience that is uniquely hers, but that we can all relate to. The album was deeply influenced by her move back her native state. Her tour title has taken its name from the album’s first song, Backroad Gravel, about growing up in Iowa.

This is Alexis’s first solo tour and will take her to roughly 50 cities around the country. She has packed herself up and is leaving her home of Iowa City to explore the back roads of America, and she’ll play a few songs along the way.
